





Symptoms







- Symptoms begin 2-14 days after exposure
- Common: fever (88%), dry cough (68%), shortness of breath (19%)
- Uncommon: (<15%) sneezing, runny nose, sore throat, chills, GI complaints

How to minimize risk

- 1. Primary Care (health maintenance, vaccinations, quit smoking, chronic diseases)
- 2. Hand washing (Do you know how and when?)
- 3. Don't touch your face and cover coughs (Dracula sneeze)
- 4. Social Distancing
- 5. Surface cleaning (High touch surfaces, cell phone, laptop)
- 6. Get good sleep, exercise, keep up healthy eating
- 7. Address pandemic anxieties

If you get sick...

- 1. Don't Panic
- 2. Self Care

Isolate in the home

Minimize contact

Cleaning and masks

Call ahead to your doctor

3. Family Care

Monitor

No sharing of utensils

Masks (one for caregiver & one for sick person)

Planning	Purpose
Guidance on Planning for Coronavirus	The Seattle and King County Office of Public Health developed this COVID-19 planning guide. Though this is less detailed than the OSHA guidance, it provides step-by-step guidance on how to initiate, implement, communicate and activate your plan.
Guidance on Preparing Workplaces	The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) developed this COVID-19 planning guide. It provides step-by-step guidance on how to develop a plan and prepare your workplace.

Communication Resources

Communication	Purpose
Coronavirus Preparedness: Sample Memo	Communication to your staff that emphasizes health and safety; practicing good hygiene; and ongoing efforts from managers to address the pandemic
Louisiana Office of Public Health: Guidance for Businesses	Guidance for organizations that provides important considerations as organizations develop their COVID-19 response plans
Louisiana Office of Public Health: Guidance for Family Preparedness	Guidance for families that will help them lessen the burden of a pandemic. This includes a checklist and factors to consider when planning (ie. school closure; remote-work; access to prescriptions)
